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As the curtain opens King Hildebrand and his court search the countryside for any sign of King Gama. Hildebrand's son Hilarion and Gama's daughter Ida were betrothed twenty years earlier, when Hilarion was two and Ida one. Now the time for the wedding has arrived, but Gama and his daughter have not. Hildebrand fears that Gama, who is a wasp-tongued "C-List" character, may renege on the deal. And when Gama's party is spotted on the horizon, the Princess is not with them. Hildebrand prepares to meet Gama with gifts if Ida is coming and jail if she is not. Hilarion enters the courtyard and immediately impresses us with his intellectual acumen as he ponders whether a marriage can last if the betrothal took place when the groom was twice as old as the bride.

At length Gama's party arrives led by his three warrior sons. Gama declares himself a philanthropist bent on pointing out others' faults and can't think why he isn't better liked. He informs Hildebrand that Princess Ida has renounced all males to found a women's university. Hilarion vows to win her back with wine and song. Hildebrand seizes Gama and his sons as hostages and Hilarion sets off on his quest with his friends Florian and Cyril.

Act II opens on Castle Adamant – the site of Ida's University. Here we meet Lady Psyche who tells the students they must only read expurgated versions of the classics and Lady Blanche who expels a student for bringing chessmen onto the campus. Ida appears to explain that, as man controls mighty elephants with his mind, so women must control men with their minds. We also find out that Lady Blanche wishes to run the school and feels she is being displaced by Lady Psyche.

At this point Hilarion and his friends enter and disguise themselves in students' robes. Princess Ida admits them as students as long as they promise not to marry men. But their cover is nearly blown when Lady Psyche recognizes her brother Florian. She tells them that the women have renounced men because men are descended from Apes and are Apes at heart. Shortly after she lays this out for the lads Lady Blanche's daughter Mellissa arrives, takes one look at Florian, and renounces the school's misandry. Lady Blanche enters as the lads are leaving and immediately pierces their clever disguises. She stays mum because if Hilarion can reclaim his wife, she will be able to "rule the roast"

Lunch is served. Cyril gets a bit tipsy, sings a bawdy song, and the man-monsters are discovered. The Princess bolts in horror and falls into a stream. Hilarion saves her but Ida condemns the men to death for their sacrilege, and sends them off in chains. At this point King Hildebrand arrives. He declares himself a "peppery potentate" who will kill Ida's brothers unless she becomes Hilarion's bride. Despite her brothers' pleas Ida vows to hurl defiance though she is "but a girl."

As Act III opens Ida vows to show that women "educated to the task, can meet Man, face to face, on his own ground." But she soon finds that her troops are afraid of rifles and explosives. Ida is so desperate that she is ready to accept help from her brothers when they show up with her father. But she learns that her men folk have come to dissuade her from fighting. Her once haughty father has been broken by Hildebrand's exquisite torture, to wit: he has been so treated that he can find "nothing whatever to grumble at." Ida agrees to a battle between her brothers and Hilarion's trio. Hilarion wins but Ida is reluctant to give up her scheme and Posterity's gratitude. Hildebrand sagely points out that the total segregation of the sexes would prevent Posterity's existence. Ida yields.
